## **Golf History**

"Skipper" Young, a graduate of the Massa-chusetts Institute of Technology, founded Titleist in 1932.

When playing a round of golf with his dentist, Young missed a sure putt that seemed to be caused by the weight of the ball.

He then asked his dentist friend to X-ray the ball and the film showed that the rubber core was off-center.

After this initial discovery, Young took X-rays of more golf balls and found that most were poorly constructed with off-center cores and prone to erratic shots.

This inspired Young to produce his line of golf balls, which would become known as Titleist.

1930: Young developed a machine that could uniformly wind rubber string around a rubber core, making a "dead center" golf ball. He named the ball "Titleist," noting it was the "winner" of the quest to create the best for the game.

Today Acushnet employs roughly 3000 people in Massachusetts, making it one of the largest employers in the region. It is headquartered in Fairhaven, Massachusetts alongside its Packing and Distribution Center about three miles south of its original location.

They also have two golf ball manufacturing plants and an R&D Technology Center located in the New Bedford Industrial Park, as well as a Custom Golf Ball plant located in New Bedford.

And all this is due as the result of a missed putt... and a lot of blood sweat and tears, persistence & dedication to making things happen!





## **Golf Genius Tips**

This month's tip will assist you if you are having troubles **Registering** for tournaments via **Golf Genius** if you are having troubles.

I highly recommend registering via a computer rather than a mobile device as it is an easier transaction with a stable network connection. If you are using a mobile device, please make sure you are connected to a stable network, and I would use caution if you're just using it over with cellular data connection.

#### **Logout of Golf Genius!**

The most common problem I see, is that members are currently logged in to Golf Genius from a previous tournament or another club. Please logout of Golf Genius prior to clicking on the registration link. Our system is not set-up to have a Username / Password to use Golf Genius. All you need is the GGID of the tournament to complete your registration.

If **you are NOT receiving** our tournament invite emails from Golf Genius, please check your Spam/Junk folder for emails from <a href="mailto:norply@golfgenius.com">norply@golfgenius.com</a>.

We also recommend you add that address to your address book which will most likely end up in your inbox.

If you would like to have quick and easy access to all the events available for our members, we suggest that you add this link https://www.golfgenius.com/ggid/qtttph to your favor-

By simply clicking on the link, you will be able to view all the past and present events, and from there you can access each event portal. You can then use the portal to sign up for a tournament, check tee sheets, or view the results of past tournaments.

# All things Rules of Golf Alec Todryk Rules Chair

Membership,

Welcome new and returning members of Los Verdes. For 2023 we will continue to operate business as usual with in the USGA and local rules outlined by the Los Verdes Rules Committee. Outlined below are two local rules that all members should be aware of while playing in events and 5 key changes to the USGA rules of golf for 2023.

#### **Local Rules**

**Smut grass Rule:** A player whose ball lies close to smut grass, in a position where the swing movement of the clubface to hit the ball is obstructed by the smut grass, is allowed to place the ball within one club-length of where the ball came to rest no nearer the hole without penalty. There is no relief for stance on smut grass, only the clubface obstruction.

Exposed Tree Root Rule: If a player's ball is in play and there is interference with the lie of the ball or the area of intended swing from exposed tree roots that are in a part of the general area of the course that covers all of the course except for the other four defined areas: (1) the teeing area the player must play from in starting the hole, (2) all penalty areas, (3) all bunkers, and (4) the putting green of the hole the player is playing, the tree roots are treated as ground under repair. The player may take free relief under Rule 16.1b. Find the nearest point of relief that is not closer to the hole and the ball must be dropped within 1 club length and come to rest in the relief area. Interference does not exist if the tree roots only interfere with the player's stance.

#### Key 2023 USGA Rules change

**Modifications for Players with Disabilities:** The modifications to the Rules for players with disabilities have been made part of the Rules and are in effect for all players who are classified in the categories covered in Rule 25.

Handicap Usage in Stroke Play: With the continued growth of score -posting technology following the adoption of the World Handicap System<sup>TM</sup>, players are no longer penalized for failing to put their handicap on their scorecard in stroke play. The committee will be responsible for ensuring the accuracy of each player's handicap.

**Club Damaged During Round:** The Rule has been amended to allow a player to replace a club that is damaged during a round, provided the player did not damage it through abuse.

**Ball Moved by Natural Forces:** A new exception provides that a ball at rest must be replaced if it moves to another area of the course or comes to rest out of bounds after being dropped, placed or replaced.

**Back-on-the-Line Relief Procedure:** The back-on-the-line relief procedure, often used for penalty area and unplayable ball relief, has been simplified so that the player now drops their ball on the line, and the ball must come to rest within one club-length of where it is dropped.

## **Handicap Chair Thoughts**

The Fun, the Good, the Bad, and the Ugly from your Handicap Chair



**Fun facts:** 22,436 rounds were posted by members in 2022. 8,007 rounds were at Los Verdes, and 14,429 rounds were played elsewhere!

**The <u>Good</u> news** is that 232 members averaged worse or within one stroke in "Home Tournaments" than they did in "Home Rounds",

**But the** <u>Bad</u> news is that 92 members somehow averaged better than one stroke in "Home Tournaments" than in "Home Rounds"!

My first thought was that it was "kind of strange", but my second thought was "this isn't right"!

I took a closer look at all posts by all members broken down by type (Home, Home Competition, Away, and Away Competition) for all 2022, and I encountered a trend I didn't like. Everybody talks about <u>sandbagging</u>, but without feeling any need whatsoever to apologize, I call it cheating!

What is the difference between winning a tournament by moving the ball to a better lie, not putting out, or applying the "hole in the pocket" trick to find a "lost ball" in the middle of the fairway, and playing with an inflated handicap index?

I don't know any member by name that cheats on the course, but I do know 23 members that averaged more than 3 shots better in tournaments, which is quite unusual to say the least. The <u>Ugly</u> is that 10 members averaged 5-7 shots better, and that 9 that averaged more than 7 shots better in tournaments! Why is that not called cheating?

The board is debating whether to publish the findings, and if we agree to do so, stay tuned for a shocking next edition of The Hacker! Either way, I will be reaching out to the members impacted by my finding to discuss the situation and will determine with the Board and Handicap Committee whether or not their Index should be adjusted down!
